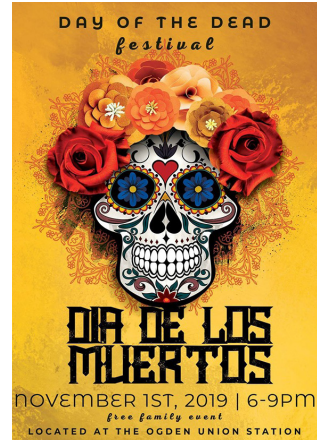

Nurture the Creative Mind will host their inaugural Dia De Los Muertos (Day of the Dead) celebration at Ogden Union Station on November 1.

This event will run from 6 - 9 p.m., and will be Ogden's chance to participate in a holiday that celebrates life and death, while honoring family members and ancestors. Dia De Los Muertos is a spiritual time of remembrance paired with vibrant festivities that are largely celebrated in Mexico and other countries in Latin America. Ogden's celebration will be a free community event that will include authentic Mexican food and music, a low rider car show, community alter presentations, education opportunities and Ballet Folklorico dance performances. Ogden City General Elections, November 5

Registered voters in Ogden can beat the lines on November 5, General Election Day, by dropping off voting ballots in a secure ballot box in the community ahead of time.

There are secure ballot boxes located in the parking lot of the City Municipal Building (2549 Washington Blvd) or the Weber County Library (2464 Jefferson Ave). This year ballots sent to registered voters through mail will arrive two weeks before the General Election. Ballots may also be returned by mail after placing a stamp or submitted in person to any of the six Weber County area voting centers on Election Day. Holiday Electric Light Parade, November 30

The Holiday Electric Light Parade on November 30 begins Ogden's winter festivities.

Starting at 5:30 p.m., elaborate floats and performances will fill Washington Boulevard from 22nd Street to 26th Street. Santa arrives on the last float, and when the parade stops at the Municipal Gardens, he will ceremoniously flip the switch that illuminates all of Christmas Village. The opening ceremony begins at approximately 6:30 p.m., featuring parade floats on display along 25th Street through the night, entertainment at the amphitheater and a spectacular closing fireworks show. Be Aware of the Risk of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is an invisible, tasteless, odorless gas that can come from fuel-burning appliances like furnaces, fireplaces and water heaters. This gas is impossible to detect with the five human senses, but it can cause serious illness and even death. Early symptoms of CO poisoning include headaches, nausea and dizziness. Worsening symptoms can include collapse, coma or death. CO poisoning is extremely dangerous for all ages and household pets, but the risk is higher for infants, 4 years old or less, and elderly, 75 years or older. To help avoid carbon monoxide poisoning:

- **Get a Carbon Monoxide detector.** A CO detector is an electronic device, much like a smoke detector, that sounds an alarm when the CO gas in the air reaches a health-threatening level, even before symptoms of poisoning are noticed.
- **DO NOT leave automobiles idling in the garage.**
- **Check all fuel-burning equipment at least once a year.**

The City is selling CO detectors at a discounted price of \$10.00 to support the Fire Department's goal of ensuring every Ogden residence has one. Those interested in purchasing a detector must bring a utility bill to prove residency to the cashier's office in the City Municipal Building (2549 Washington Blvd Suite 240).

 - **Protect IT:** Update to the latest security software, web browser and operating systems. Never connect to unsecured Wi-Fi networks.
