Census Day is April 1 - You Matter, Be Counted

Shaping your future. The results of the 2020 Census will help determine how hundreds of billions of dollars in federal funding flow into communities every year for the next decade. That funding shapes many different aspects of every community, no matter the size, no matter the location.

Why the Census Matters.

- **Healthcare.** Census results affect planning and funding for healthcare—including programs such as Medicaid, Medicare Part B, State Children's Health Insurance, and the prevention and treatment of substance abuse.
- **Local School Impact.** Census results affect planning and funding for education—including programs such as Head Start, Pell Grants, school lunches, rural education, adult education, and grants for preschool special education.
- **Roads and Transit.** Census results affect planning and funding for infrastructure—including programs for highway planning and construction, Section 8 housing, federal transit, community development, and rural water and waste disposal systems.
- **Employment and Training.** Census results affect planning and funding for employment and training—including programs for vocational rehabilitation state grants, dislocated workers, and American Indian and Alaska Native employment and training.

Get the facts. The census provides critical data that lawmakers, business owners, teachers, and many others use to provide daily services, products, and support for you and your community. Every year, billions of dollars in federal funding go to hospitals, fire departments, schools, roads, and other resources based on census data.

Your Privacy Matters. The U.S. Census Bureau is bound by law to protect your answers and keep them strictly confidential. In fact, every employee takes an oath to protect your personal information for life.

The Census Bureau is bound by Title 13 of the U.S. Code to keep your information confidential.

Under Title 13, the Census Bureau cannot release any identifiable information about you, your home, or your business, even to law enforcement agencies. The law ensures that your private data is protected and that your answers cannot be used against you by any government agency or court.

How to respond. By April 1, 2020, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. You will have three options for responding:

- **Online - www.my2020census.gov**
- **By Phone - Number will be provided on Census form delivered to your home**
- **By Mail - Forms will be delivered to each household**

In mid-March, households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census.

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you recently completed another survey from the Census Bureau. A complete and accurate count is critical for you and your community, because the results of the 2020 Census will affect community funding, congressional representation, and more.

Registration for youth co-ed fishing club is currently open. Co-ed Fishing Club is on Thursdays from 6-8 p.m. beginning April 16, 2020. Learn to fish at Glasmann Pond. We have beginner, intermediate and advanced classes. The intermediate class is for students 9 years and older with 2 years of previous lessons. The advanced class is for students who have previously taken the intermediate class. Children who are 12 and 13 years old are required to obtain a \$5 fishing license which is good for a year from date of purchase and can be purchased at any Utah State Fishing License Agent.

• **Two Hours of fishing instruction each evening - parents and family members are encouraged to participate.**

• **No fishing pole or gear required. You may bring your own if desired.**
