River Safety

Ogden is a lively town, with so many beautiful rivers to enjoy. Nonetheless, it's that time of year again where these rivers that flow through Ogden are rising and moving fast. This can bring a multitude of dangers. It doesn't take a lot of moving water to knock someone off their feet into a fast-moving river, especially for small children. With melting snow, and the spring rain, it can cause the rivers to rise and accelerate. Here are some tips to stay safe during the run-off season:

- Do not let your children or pets play in the water**
- Keep a safe distance of 15 feet or more away from the river**
- If anyone falls in the river and is in danger, DO NOT go in after them. Call 911**



Stay Safe On Ogden Trails

The trails are still open to the public, and it's a great time of year to go on a hike!

Weber County has such an amazing trail system with so many hikes to try. Ogden Trail Network would like to remind everyone of proper trail etiquette to ensure that everyone can have a safe and enjoyable experience.

- **Respect private property**
- **No smoking or vaping**
- **No camping or fires**
- **All pets must be on a leash**
- **Bikers yield to hikers**
- **Avoid using wet or muddy trails**
- **Do not disturb plant and animal life**
- **Downhill traffic yield to uphill traffic**
- **Stay on the trail, do not cut switchbacks**
- **Pack it in—pack it out**
- **No motorized vehicles (unless marked as authorized)**
- **No target practice**



We would also like to remind everyone out there to practice social distancing on the trails. Please do not congregate at trailheads. Keep groups small, and stay at least 6 feet apart from people outside of your group as well. Make sure you stay safe, but equally important, have fun!

Emergency Preparedness: Know Your Home

Make it your business to become familiar with the infrastructure of your home. Take extra steps in learning how to operate electric circuits, natural gas service controls, culinary water main valves, outside air vents, etc.

- **Locate necessary tools where they will become handy in an emergency situation**
- **Consult appropriate experts if necessary**
- **Know when it is necessary to turn utilities on or off**

Remember, during a "shelter-in-place" it may be necessary to turn off air conditioning/heating systems which can bring outside air into the space providing shelter. In schools and workplaces, this may require the services of a custodian.
