The 2020 Census can be taken anywhere, and it only takes a few minutes to complete.

En tu casa ya debieron de haber recibido el formulario del censo. La agencia del censo hace un conteo de la población de los estados unidos cada 10 años. Este formulario hace nueve (9) preguntas sencillas sobre cada persona que vive en tu casa. Nueve preguntas que toman 10 minutos, pero impactan tu futuro y el de tu familia en este país.

No existe ninguna pregunta sobre tu ciudadanía o la de las personas que viven en tu casa. El censo no te pregunta por tu seguro social, cuenta de banco, ni te pide dinero. Puedes llenar tu formulario del censo por internet o teléfono en 13 idiomas incluyendo español. Si no has llenado tu formulario del censo antes del primero de junio un trabajador del censo tocará tu puerta para hacerte las preguntas en persona y llenar el censo por ti. Toda información proporcionada es confidencial y no se comparte con ninguna otra agencia ya sea federal o local.

It's Almost Firework Season

The Ogden City Fire Department encourages you to enjoy fireworks responsibly this holiday season.

Remember that consumer fireworks can be dangerous, and we want to ensure the safety of everyone in the community. On Independence Day in a typical year, far more U.S. fires are reported than on any other day. Fireworks account for two out of five of those fires. We ask that the community follow these guidelines when using fireworks:

- **Follow label instructions**
- **Have an adult present at all times**
- **Never point or throw fireworks at another person**
- **Use fireworks only outdoors in a clear area at least 20 feet, (30 feet for aerial devices), away from buildings and vehicles**
- **Never carry fireworks in your pocket or shoot them in a metal or glass container**
- **Light one item at a time and then move back quickly**
- **Keep a bucket of water or garden hose ready**
- **Fireworks may be discharged from July 2nd – July 5th, and July 22nd – July 25th**

Remember that only fireworks that are for sale in Utah are legal in Ogden City. As the summer progresses and conditions are monitored, fireworks may be banned in certain areas due to drought.

A Reminder About Trash

Garbage collection has been increasingly difficult due to a large part of our community taking more deliveries at home during the red and orange phases of the Governor's Utah Leads 2.0 Plan.

It is wonderful how busy the community has been with spring cleaning while at home. It is making our city look amazing, and we thank you for that. Here are a few reminders to help garbage collection be as efficient as possible.

- Please breakdown any cardboard boxes, or cut them into 2' x 2' pieces**
- Please do not stack any garbage or boxes outside of City supplied trash bins.** The driver is not required to pick anything outside of the bin unless they create the mess.
- Don't pack garbage too tightly in the cart so that it can be released when being collected**
- Please make sure the lid to your cart is closed**

Water Conservation Tips

Please do your part to help Ogden City conserve water! Summer can be harsh and it can have an impact on our water. Make sure to perform routine checks on your irrigation system to ensure you are using water as efficiently as possible.

- Check for issues such as broken or misaligned heads, and line breaks**
- Remember to adjust your watering schedule based on the water needs of your landscape.** This will vary with changes in the weather.
- Do not water between 10 am - 6 pm.** Evaporation rates are higher during this time period, which results in less water reaching the roots of your plants.

Emergency Preparedness: Take Inventory

In the event of an evacuation order, there may be only minutes to take property with you.

Limitations of time and space may suggest the need to pre-position and/or protect belongings. Inventory items of special value and importance should be placed in a specific area of the house, with an assigned priority to each.

Usually, the items with the most value or importance will be family records, genealogies, irreplaceable photos, etc. A plan to consolidate the location and enhance the portability of high-priority items should follow. The very act of producing this list may prove a useful reminder of the things that really have value in our lives.
