Applications Still Being Accepted for Ogden CARES Business Grant Program

In July, Ogden City launched the Ogden CARES Business Grant Program to provide funds to struggling Ogden businesses. This includes

sole-proprietorships and nonprofits—demonstrating a financial shortfall resulting from the impacts of COVID-19. To qualify for the grant, the business must demonstrate a financial shortfall (expenses exceed income) during the COVID-19 impact period. Additionally, the business must have operating costs from the impact period not covered by any other COVID-19 financial assistance.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis while funds remain available. Businesses are encouraged to apply as soon as possible for the best chance to receive funding.

Are You Ready When Disaster Hits?

Disasters often happen without much warning, and the outcome of those disasters is mostly dependent on our preparedness.

The term disaster is often attached to a wide-spread natural disaster. Disaster can be any circumstance that negatively affects you and your family's livelihood. There are a few simple steps we can all take to lessen effects of a disaster. The first thing to learn when getting ready are the four cornerstones of emergency preparedness: Be informed, make a plan, build a kit, and get involved.

- **Be Informed:** Identify the types of disasters that are likely to occur in your area. We are susceptible to earthquakes and severe weather but can also be affected by wildfires, landslides, floods, hazardous materials, and pandemics. Learn your community's emergency plan for the following: County, city plan, school, workplace, faith-based plan, etc. Understand your insurance coverage and invest in the appropriate type of insurance for your hazard. Additionally, you can sign up for CODE RED to receive emergency alerts from Ogden city. It will also be helpful to sign up for local weather alerts.
- **Make a Plan:** Make a plan for yourself, your family, and your pets. Do you have a communication plan? How, where, and when will you communicate with family. Suppose cell service is down, it's essential to identify a meeting place outside of your home. Identify any particular circumstances in your household that you need to account for in any situation. Include medical conditions, children, pets, extended family, and finances. Ensure your family members are informed of your emergency plan.
- **Build a Kit:** Prepare a grab-n-go kit with items most likely needed by your family circumstances. Include food, water, hygiene items, clothing, medications, PPE, cash, and first aid items. If you cannot remain at home, identify an alternate location for a shelter.
- **Get Involved:** There are opportunities in your community for volunteering and training for when a disaster happens. Sign up for the next Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training, where you can learn skills like First Aid and CPR.

Be prepared and be ahead of a disaster.
