New Murals To See In Downtown Ogden

Ogden City is pleased to announce the completion of its newest mural installation in the heart of downtown along the Grant Avenue Promenade. Don Rimx was able to complete the remarkable installation in just under one month. To date, the Grant Avenue Mural Project is the largest public art addition in Ogden City.



David "Don Rimx" Sepulveda was selected from a national field of artists who were vying for the unique opportunity to install a large-scale mural on the expansive walls of the parking structure that line the Grant Avenue Promenade.

In the fall of 2020, Ogden City Arts set out on the national search for an artist to beautify the five 30'x50' walls with a focus on art that is timeless and forward-thinking. Local, state, and national artists were invited to apply, and more than 150 submissions were received. All submissions were reviewed and graded by the Ogden City Arts Advisory Committee and a recommendation was moved forward for Mayor Caldwell to issue final approval. The project is funded by the Ogden Public Art fund and has a budget of \$175,000.

Don is a nationally celebrated muralist who is a classically trained artist and accomplished corporate graffitist. He has completed many notable installations from California to New York and has been the focus of national media on several occasions. His unique artistry style is said to "bridge the gap between the streets and corporate America."

Don and his family fully submerged themselves in the Ogden lifestyle during their stay and have created lasting and meaningful relationships with many in our community.

Famed adventure photographer and local, Cam McLeod, documented the process and will release his work in the upcoming weeks. The installation is sure to be a staple in Ogden's emerging art scene for years to come.

New CERT Class Available In Ogden

If you missed registration for the previous CERT class, a new one is available for Ogden City residents.

The training course will begin October 21 and be held each Thursday through November 11, 2021, from 6:00-9:00 p.m. at the Weber County Sheriff Complex, 1400 South Depot Drive. The best access to this location is on 12th Street to Depot Drive and then 2 blocks south.

CERT courses provide information about disaster preparedness for hazards that might impact the local area and educates in basic disaster response skills. The fee of \$35 pays for personal CERT safety gear. The training course contains two parts. The first portion being online, and the second being the in-person classes where you will practice your newly learned skills. If you are interested, please register at:

Emergency Preparedness: Wildfires

Cool spring weather helps grass grow tall, which becomes a fire hazard as the grass dries out toward the end of summer and the beginning of fall. Here are ways to prepare a home to survive if it's ever caught in a wildfire.



• **Prepare at home:** Have a fire extinguisher on hand and teach family members where it's kept and how to use it. Have an evacuation plan, communications plan, meeting place, and an updated 72-hour kit ready to go. Make sure the home address is visible from the street. Keep fire hydrants unobstructed and be aware of any burning restrictions in the area.

• **Fortify against embers:** Clean roofs and gutters of outdoor debris. Replace or repair any loose or missing shingles, damaged or loose window screens, and any broken windows. Install 1/8" metal mesh screening in the eaves of vents. Screen or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent combustible materials from accumulating.

• **Avoid putting flammable items in dangerous places:** Remove anything stored underneath decks or porches. Move mulch, leaves and needles, firewood piles, and any other flammable material away from wall exteriors. Landscape with fire-resistant plants and create small fuel breaks with hardscaping features. Create defensible space by pruning low-hanging tree branches and thinning trees and brush within 30 feet of a residence.
