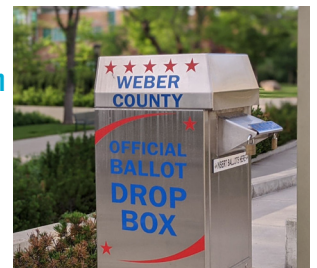

Ogden City General Elections, November 2

Registered voters in Ogden can beat the lines on November 2, General Election Day, by dropping off voting ballots in a secure ballot box in the community ahead of time.

There are secure ballot boxes located in the parking lot of the City Municipal Building (2549 Washington Blvd) or the Weber County Library (2464 Jefferson Ave). The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 2, 2021. Ballots will be mailed to voters beginning October 12, 2021. If you have not received a ballot by October 19th, contact the Weber County Elections Office at 801-399-8034. Ballots may also be returned by mail after placing a stamp or submitted in person to any of the six Weber County area voting centers on Election Day. Be Aware Of Carbon Monoxide Poisoning As It Cools Down

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is an invisible, tasteless, odorless gas that can come from fuel-burning appliances like furnaces, fireplaces, and water heaters. This gas is impossible

to detect with the five human senses, but it can cause serious illness and even death. Early symptoms of CO poisoning include headaches, nausea, and dizziness. Worsening symptoms can include collapse, coma, or death. CO poisoning is extremely dangerous for all ages and household pets, but the risk is higher for infants under 4, and elderly 75 years or older. To help avoid carbon monoxide poisoning:

- **Get a Carbon Monoxide detector.**
- **DO NOT leave automobiles idling in the garage.**
- **Check all fuel-burning equipment at least once a year.**

The City is selling CO detectors at a discounted price of \$10.00 to support the Fire Department's goal of ensuring every Ogden residence has one. Those interested in purchasing a detector must bring a utility bill to prove residency to the cashier's office in the City Municipal Building (2549 Washington Blvd Suite 240).

- **Cybersecurity First:** Keep cybersecurity at the front of your mind as you connect daily. Research before purchasing a device or digital product. Consider your privacy or security settings when setting up a new device or app, and consider updating old/default passwords.
