Ogden City Community and Economic Development 2021 Review

The positive community momentum and energy, enhancing our City's economic vitality is making Ogden a better place to live, work and do business! Below you can review some of the recent and ongoing Community and Economic Development initiatives and numerous commercial growth announcements.



"Make Ogden" – Downtown Development Projects

- **26th Street Corridor Improvements:** Improvements between Washington and Wall, including new utility infrastructure, sidewalks, bike path, lighting, and paving.
- **New Wonder Block Mixed-Use Development (In-progress):** This will be located at the former Hostess site, along 26th Street between Grant Avenue and Lincoln Avenue. With construction planned to start in early 2022, the new downtown development will provide a mix of needed housing, retail, commercial, parking, and unique outdoor spaces.
- **Enhanced Public Transportation System (In-progress):** BRT's soon-to-be completed new bus route and stops between UTA's FrontRunner station, through downtown and Harrison Boulevard, to Weber State University and McKay-Dee Hospital.
- **Planning for the Union Station Area (In-progress):** This will include restoration of the station and mixed-use development in the adjacent areas.

Community Improvement Projects

In addition to the Make Ogden related projects, Ogden Community and Economic Development has been engaged in several other key improvement projects to enhance our community.

- **Riverbend Ogden Enhancements:** There has been development along the Ogden River and improved river access for recreation.
- **Ogden Business Exchange Development:** Extensive redevelopment of the former Ogden Stockyard as a new business park featuring outdoor recreation amenities.
- **Nine Rails Creative District Additions:** Featuring the new Dumke Arts Plaza at 25th and Ogden Avenue, and beautiful new art murals added along Grant Avenue and other locations this past summer.

Other City Improvements

- **Expanded Flight Service:** Flight service through the Ogden-Hinckley Airport has expanded, and you can fly in and out of the Ogden-Hinckley airport to the Phoenix area, as well as the Hollywood/Burbank area. Check out the detail at flyogden.com.
- **Increased Housing Options:** To meet our community's growth needs, private development of multifamily housing has dramatically increased. In addition, our Community Development Team continues to implement new infill housing projects that create a balance of housing types and affordability levels in our community.

Business Development Activities/Successes

The pandemic certainly impacted our community, especially small businesses and disadvantaged populations. However, overall business sales revenues have remained strong, and the unemployment rate in our area is just 2.8%, and about 700 new jobs have been announced during the last year.

2022 Holiday Trash Collection Schedule

Ogden City sees changes to City department hours and garbage collection schedules during various government holidays. The following schedule for the 2021 year will help residents stay up to date on which holidays to anticipate those delays. Green and blue trash cans should be brought onto the street curb by 6:00 a.m. on collection day. The lids must be able to close completely, and cans should be spaced 5 feet from any obstructions (vehicle, tree, mailbox, etc.). Ogden City does not provide curbside pick-up for items left outside of the cans. Home Heating Fire Prevention Tips

Home heating fires are now the second leading cause of house fires, and they usually peak in January during the early evening hours between 5-9 p.m.



Home heating sources include space heaters, fireplaces, wood stoves, and furnaces. Confined fires, such as chimneys account for 75% of home heating fires. Most nonconfined fires happen because the heat source, like a space heater or portable fireplace, is too close to things that can burn. Follow these tips to stay safe this winter season:

- **Never** leave a candle unattended or use an oven to heat the home.
- **Keep** anything that can burn at least 3 feet from all heat sources, including fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, space heaters, or candles.
- **Turn off** space heaters when leaving the room or going to bed.
- **Maintain** heating equipment and chimneys by having them cleaned and inspected each year by a professional.

Emergency Preparedness: Winter Driving

According to the DOT, there are approximately 1.2 million weather-related vehicle crashes every year – leading to, on average, nearly 6,000 fatalities and over 445,000 injuries.

Be vigilant while traveling in snow, ice, fog, or soaking rain this winter by preparing in advance with the following tips:

- **Ready your vehicle:** Check vehicle batteries, wipers, coolant, tires, and other systems that are most affected when the temperature drops. Make sure all tires have good tread and clear the car of snow and ice from the windows, headlights, and taillights. Stock vehicles with a winter supply kit that includes: phone charger, batteries, blankets, flashlight, first aid kit, food, sand, shovel, ice scraper, and jumper cables. Check weather forecasts and road conditions consistently incase it is hazardous to travel.
- **While on the road:** Keep vehicle gas tanks over half full, take frequent breaks on road trips, drive slower than usual, and leave more room between surrounding vehicles. Remember to give snowplows plenty of room to work and only pass when it is safe to do so.
- **Focus on safety:** Always wear a seatbelt, never drive while texting, make phone calls, and never while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
