Ogden City Council To Review Proposed Fiscal Year 2023 City Budget

Each year, the Ogden City Council's responsibility is to review and approve the Ogden City budget with the Five-Year Strategic Plan in mind. The Strategic Plan Directives of Economic Development, Community Safety, Recreation, and City Image & Appearance guide the Council in their decision making, especially with the budget.



Over the following months, the Council will review budget proposals for each department in the city with the department directors. Public hearings will also be held to allow input to be received from Ogden residents. The Council can adjust the budget as they see fit before it's finally adopted before the fiscal year begins in July.

After a tax increase in the Fiscal Year 2018 budget, the Council expressed interest in considering an increase every other year. Due to the pandemic, this has not been done since. As a result, a tax increase may be considered this year. The Council will need to go through the Truth in Taxation process for a tax increase. This process requires the Council to notify Ogden residents of the increase. This would also require a Truth in Taxation hearing in early August to facilitate additional input from the public.

Juneteenth

Juneteenth, short for "June nineteenth," is a federal holiday in the U.S. and a Utah State Holiday. It commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African-Americans. It is also observed for celebrating African-American culture.



The holiday originated in Galveston, Texas, and has been celebrated annually on June 19th in various ways in various parts of the United States since 1865. The day was recognized as a federal holiday on June 17, 2021, when President Joe Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act into law. In celebration of this event, Juneteenth will be observed, closing all Ogden City offices on Monday, June 20.

Memorial Day Clean Up Monday, June 6, 2022

Emergency Preparedness: Stovetop Cooking

Everyone loves a home-cooked meal, and we spend a lot of time in the kitchen preparing for them. Between 2016 and 2018, there were 189,000 home cooking fires in the US which caused 170 deaths, 3300 injuries, and \$443 million in property loss. Here are a few safety suggestions as we cook our meals:



- **Keep an eye on what you fry.** Most cooking fires start from frying food.
- **Watch what you are cooking,** and stay alert and focused on your meal.
- **Turn pot handles towards the back of the stove.** This prevents them from getting bumped or pulled over.
- **Move things away from the stove that can burn.** Dishtowels, bags, boxes, and paper can all easily ignite.
