Ogden City Officials to Residents: "Thank You for Conserving Water!"

After several years of below-average snowpack, mindful use of water has been a priority request from water managers to customers. "We are proud of our residents and business owners for their efforts and want to send them a huge thanks," said Ogden's Water Manager, Brady Herd. "It is evident in our capacities and production that we are using less water as a whole."

In comparing the City's 2022 water production totals during the months of April through July with the same period in 2021, there has been a 14.6% reduction. In comparing those same months in 2022 with the average from the previous two years, there has been a 17% reduction! This is attributed in part to factors including outdoor watering conservation, replacement of old, leaky pipes, and reduction of use in individual households.

As residents continue to conserve water, Pineview Reservoir has begun to realign with historical statistics slowly. As of Monday, August 8th Pineview's storage capacity was at 48% compared to 26% of capacity on the same day in 2021. These water stores are critical, particularly when planning for the future.

Ogden residents are encouraged to continue with their individual efforts and are invited to come into the public works building to get a free moisture meter and conservation kit. Water customers can also set up a water audit with the water conservation coordinator to see if there is anything else that can be adjusted.

Marshall White Center Current Classes

There are multiple classes currently for all age groups to enjoy.

- Youth classes:** Multiple classes start the week of September 12th. The cost is \$10 for six weeks of classes.
- Archery classes:** Tuesday from 4-5 p.m. or Thursday from 4-5 p.m.
- Hawaiian dance:** Come learn Hawaiian dance Thursday nights! This is for ages 12 to 17 and adults/seniors. Youth and senior prices are \$15; the adult price is \$20 for a six weeks.
- Adult pottery:** There be a new session starting on Tuesday, September 6th. The class will make mini pumpkins in this session, just in time for the fall season. The first session is \$10 for the studio fee and 1lb of clay; additional clay is \$3 per pound. The studio fee for the rest of the month is \$3 for adults and \$2 for seniors.

New CERT Training Course Available

The Weber County CERT Council is offering a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) basic training course that begins on October 20, 2022. It will be held each Thursday through November 10 from 6:00-9:00 p.m. at the Weber County Sheriff Complex, 1400 South Depot Drive in the Training Annex, directly west of the Administration and Correctional Facility Building. CERT courses provide information about disaster preparedness for hazards that could impact the local area and educates in basic disaster response skills. There is a fee of \$35 to help cover the cost of each person's CERT safety gear. The training course contains two parts. The first portion being online, and the second being the in-person classes where you will practice your newly learned skills.
