Ogden Express (OGX) Open to the Public Starting August 20

Over the past 20 years, Utah Transit Authority and Ogden City have worked towards offering a higher form of transportation for residents, businesses, and students. OGX, Ogden's brand new Bus Rapid Transit Line (BRT), combines the capacity and speed of light rail with the flexibility and lower cost of bus transportation. Plus, with dedicated lanes and traffic signal priority, BRT gets riders to their destinations quicker.




Thanks to generous seed money from UTA, Ogden City, Weber County, Weber State University, Intermountain Health, the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), and the Wasatch Front Regional Council, 35% of the \$130 million needed to build OGX was raised. The Federal Transit Administration funded the remaining \$84.5 million with a Small Starts Grant.

OGX is set to open to the public on August 20. Patrons will be able to ride for free for the first three years! Come celebrate during the Grand Opening Event at Farmers Market Ogden on August 26 from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the corner of 25th Street and Washington Blvd. We will have a Willy Wonka bus with chocolate for the kids, fanny packs to win 100 Golden Tickets for prizes, and fun activities for the whole family. Plus, UTA will be offering Zero Fare on FrontRunner, bus, TRAX, and Paratransit for the entire day.

The Route: Buses will arrive at stations every 10 minutes Monday through Friday from 4:30 a.m. to 11 p.m., every 15 minutes on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m., and every 30 minutes on Sunday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Stops include Ogden Central Station, The Junction, Downtown Ogden, 25th Street, Weber County Library, Monroe Park, Mt. Ogden Jr. High School, Mt. Ogden High School, Harrison Boulevard, Weber State University, Dee Events Center, and McKay-Dee Hospital.

A Message from Weber State: Weber State University has had three Wildcat Shuttle stops operating on campus since August 2022. The shuttle has been very helpful for WSU students, serving approximately 2,000 passengers daily during the fall and spring semesters. With the completed line, OGX provides more opportunities for students and the community to connect.

A Message from McKay Dee Hospital: For more than 110 years, Intermountain McKay-Dee Hospital has been proud to be part of the Ogden community. We've grown alongside the community and look forward to being part of this next step in growth. We are proud to be a primary stop along the new UTA OGX. Patients who may have delayed care due to transportation issues can now access safe and reliable transportation from around Weber County and the Wasatch Front.

An Effort To Help Small Businesses In Ogden

Ogden City's Business Information Center (BIC) is having a successful year after providing nine loans to locally owned small businesses. These businesses wanted to gain a more stable financial footing and expand their dreams. Julio Otay, Senior Project Coordinator with the Business Information Center, says, "Our main purpose is to help the entrepreneur start up or get the business to continue in a role of success. We have great resources that other cities don't provide." The BIC is the city's answer to entrepreneurs needing business resources like capital opportunities, technical assistance, and business development counseling while partnering with the Suazo Business Center and Weber State University Wildcat Microfund. "The benefit for Ogden is mainly the job creation. We know that when a business is successful, it will require more employees. We want those businesses to stay here in Ogden, the jobs and taxes to stay here. It's beneficial for the city and those who live in Ogden," explains Otay.

Emergency Preparedness Message: Wildfires

August is when our wildfire season picks up, and wildfires spread quickly, igniting brush, trees, and homes. Learning about the dangers of wildfires can help save your home. Residents can reduce the risk of fire at their house by making a few modifications and by being prepared.

- **Design and landscape your home with wildfire safety in mind. Select materials and plants that can help contain fire rather than fuel it.**
- **Choose heat and flame-resistant construction materials for homes, decks, porches, and fences when possible.**
- **Keep lawns trimmed, leaves raked, and the roof and rain gutters free from debris such as dead limbs and leaves.**
- **Store flammable materials, liquids, and solvents in metal containers outside your residence**
- **Create a defensible space by thinning trees and brush within 30 feet of your home.**
- **Keep your fire hydrants clear and unobstructed.**
- **Always have a fire extinguisher on hand and teach family members where it's kept and how to use it.**

If you must leave your home, ensure you have an evacuation plan, communications plan, and a meeting place. Also, be sure your 72-hour kit is updated and ready to go.
