Everything You Need to Know About the 2023 Christmas Village and Holiday Electric Light Parade

Christmas Village will light up the downtown Ogden Municipal Gardens (353 E 25th Street) beginning November 25, 2023, after the Holiday Electric Light Parade. This annual holiday display in Ogden

will feature activities and entertainment until December 23, 2023, and the lights will be on until January 1, 2024.

The Village: Cottages sponsored and created by the

community will turn historic downtown into a nightly vision of Santa's Village at the North Pole, from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., Sunday through Thursday, and 5:00 p.m. to Midnight on Friday and Saturday. This year's theme for the Christmas Village festivities is "Snow Place Like Ogden," and visitors can find an item in each of the cottages as they explore the displays. Visitors to the village can also vote for their favorite cottage at ogdencity.com/christmasvillage

The Santa Run, Holiday Electric Light Parade, and Christmas Village Opening Gala: The festivities for Christmas Village kick off November 25 with the Santa Run, then the Holiday Electric Light Parade, followed by the Opening Gala, and finishing with a firework show in the Ogden Amphitheater. Breakfast with Santa: A Breakfast with Santa event will be hosted at the Ogden Union Station on December 9. Reservations are required to attend the event and can be made at ogdencity.com/christmasvillage.

The Mini Polar Express Train featuring a glow-in-the-dark Christmas Tunnel is located in the northwest corner of the Municipal Gardens. It runs Monday through Friday, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., and Saturday from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.

2023 Elections - Make Sure You Register!

The primary election in Ogden City has concluded, narrowing down the field of candidates vying for key positions in city governance. Election Day is Tuesday, November 21.

For the position of mayor, the choice now stands between Taylor Knuth and Ben Nadolski.

In District 4, voters will decide between Dave Graf and Steven Van Wagoner for the City Council seat.

In the At-Large Seat C on the City Council, the race is between Shaun Myers and Levi Anderson.

Council member Richard Hyer will also be on the ballot, as he is running unopposed for his seat to represent District 2.

Voters have the option to participate in the election either by mail or in person. For those who prefer to mail in their vote, ballots were sent to all registered voters the week of October 31. Mail-in ballots must be postmarked by the U.S. Post Office the day of or prior to Election Day.

For in-person voting, polling stations will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day at the Weber Center and the Ogden Valley Library.

Emergency Preparedness: Food Storage

Food and Water Storage are essential principles of preparedness and should be budgeted into your monthly spending. Where to start:

- **Make a List:** Assess your needs depending on your household size (don't forget about your pets). Determine items that your family likes to eat so you know what to look for while you are doing your usual shopping.
- **Inventory Your Storage:** Keep areas organized and accessible so you don't let items get beyond their expiration date.
- **Eat What You Store, And Store What You Eat**
- **Different Food Storage:** Don't limit your storage to canned, dehydrated, or freeze-dried food. Start building your store of grains, legumes, fats & oils, powdered milk, salt, sugar or honey, and water. Once you have a good six-month supply built, you can continue with food items that will store even longer, have a low moisture content, and can last 20-30 years.
- **Learn a New Skill:** Try new things like growing your own garden and saving the food from it. Everyone has different needs and can do this at different levels. The important thing is that you get started today!
