Dump Passes

2024 dump passes will be available from March 1st through June 30th. These dump passes are given to help residents dispose of items that are not allowed, or don't fit in household cans. Two passes per residential Ogden City Water Utility account are available. Each pass is equivalent to the minimum load value and can be used together or separately at the Weber County Transfer Station. To obtain the dump passes, please bring a picture ID and a utility bill to the Public Works Building, 133 W 29th Street, or the Ogden City Community Services Building, 1875 Monroe Blvd. If the resident is on the current Ogden City Utility billing, that is sufficient.

City Council Adopts Amendments to Snow Removal Ordinance

During City Council meeting on January 9th, Ogden's Snow Removal Requirement Ordinance (10-5-21) underwent several amendments after months of discussion and community input.

These changes are now in effect, aiming to enhance the efficiency of snow removal operations while keeping our community safe.

Key Changes:

Street Parking Restrictions:

- On-street parking is prohibited during snowfall or when snow removal operations are apparent or imminent.

Exemptions for Certain Properties:

- Properties without a driveway approach are exempt.
- State roads are exempt from the street parking restrictions.
- The Mayor or designee can grant exemptions for streets with insufficient off-street parking.

Snowbound Vehicles:

- Snowbound vehicles on the street must be relocated within 48 hours or will be subject to impound.

Community cooperation is crucial. Ogden residents play a vital role in supporting these efforts by adhering to the updated guidelines. By doing so, we collectively contribute to the effectiveness of snow removal and the overall well-being of our community.

Zone Ogden – Development Code Update

Ogden City is updating all of its development codes. The project is called Zone Ogden, and overall goal of Zone Ogden is to create a single document that includes all the codes and standards that are required to develop in Ogden. The final document will become Ogden City's Unified Development Code.

Ogden City is currently drafting the first portion of the unified development code. Ogden City plans to host a public open house between February and March to receive public input on the first portion of draft unified development code text.

Ogden City is still receiving input through the second questionnaire. The questionnaire touches on a variety of topics, such as lighting, signage, landscaping, and parking. A brief presentation from the open house is available to inform you about these topics. Interviews were conducted by the consultant selection committee with each consultant team that responded, and the Logan Simpson team has been selected. Ogden City is working with Logan Simpson to finalize the project's scope of work to update the entire general plan. The General Plan Update will begin with a citywide visioning process to gather input from all residents and stakeholders. The vision will guide the general plan throughout the planning process.
