...the best way to get people to engage and voice their preference.



This survey asked respondents to imagine a perfect day in the Union Station Neighborhood and describe it from different perspectives (i.e., your own, a Weber State student, a young family, etc.) Responses from all questions were analyzed to extract common themes, which are listed on the right in order of how frequently they were mentioned.

- 84 restaurants, dining, eat, food, lunch
- 62 shop, shopping, gifts, stores, retail
- 42 museums
- 16 trees
- 15 bars, cocktails, coffee

- 15 special events
- 14 kids, family-friendly
- 12 concerts, music, bands
- 12 walk, walkable
- 8 parks, green spaces
- 8 history




Wondering where Survey 2 responses are? Only 5 people responded to the survey, which is not enough to draw conclusions from. The survey asked about the museums at Union Station.



1924-1970S


- Restaurant and Dining Hall

- Shoe shining
- Red Cross Canteen (1942-46, served WWII Soldiers)
- **Social Clubs, which used depot space to host movie nights, choir practice, and general meetings, among other activities**
- The Depot Barber Shop
- US Terminal Railway Post Office building
- Offices for Amtrak, railroad companies, the Pacific Fruit Express, telephone operators, and more
- **Convention Spaces**
- Train Waiting Area
- **Coffee shop** (run by Barkalow Brothers for most of its existence)
- Laundromat for UP and Ogden (Laundry building)
- Ogden Union Railway and depot Company Federal Credit Union (became Goldenwest Credit Union today)
- Union Depot, Union Pacific, Southern Pacific booster league of Ogden







Museums

Size – To adequately house the current collections and make room for additional artifacts in collection the new museum facility needs to be 115,000 s.f.


Accessibility – Provide accessible and available parking to support the museum functions and events.

Experience – Curate an immersive experience for visitors and guests that connects them with Ogden and its rich history.


