Get a Free Tree For Your Parking Strip

Ogden's tree-lined streets establish the character of our neighborhoods, and the trees we plant today will be enjoyed by generations to come.

Each year, the City provides a Tree Nursery so residents can get a free tree to plant in their parking strip that matches the needs of a person's yard.

Beginning April 2nd, every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 8:00 am - 12:00 pm, trees will be available for residents. Please call the Parks & Cemetery Office at 801-629-8284 to schedule an appointment to pick up a tree, limit one per household, at Ogden's Green Waste Facility at 1845 Monroe Blvd. We will continue to give away trees until we run out of trees.

Residents must provide information about overhead power lines, the length and width of their parking strip, and the lot location, as well as a current Ogden Water bill and picture ID. Please limit the number of people that come to the tree nursery to 2 individuals.

Dump Passes And Green Waste Information

2024 dump passes are now available for Ogden City residents through June 30th. These dump passes are given to help dispose of items that are not allowed in, or don't fit in, household cans. Two passes per residential Ogden City Water Utility account are available. Each pass is valued equivalent to the minimum load value and can be used together or separately at the Weber County Transfer Station. To obtain the dump passes, please bring a current picture ID and a current utility bill to the Public Works Building, located at 133 W 29th Street, or the Ogden City Community Services Building, located at 1875 Monroe Blvd.

Ogden City Cemetery Spring Clean-Up

Ogden City Cemetery crews will begin spring clean-up of the cemetery on Monday, March

18, 2024. It takes approximately one week for this process to be complete. Before that date, patrons are encouraged to pick up all grave decorations, including flowers, statues, shepherds' hooks, solar lights, vases, fences, rocks, etc. Remembrances can be placed back after Monday, March 25, 2024.

As a reminder, fences, solar lights, statues, rocks, and other such grave decorations are not allowed in the cemetery during the maintenance season: March 15, 2024, through October 15, 2024. Emergency Preparedness: Carbon Monoxide

Be aware of the dangers of carbon monoxide, which is also known as the "silent killer."

With the cooler weather, we close up our home to keep the warmth in. The warmth comes from furnaces and fireplaces, which burn fuel and give off carbon monoxide, as does the water heater and other appliances in our homes. Unfortunately, carbon monoxide can leak into our living areas and cause illness or death in extreme cases.

Carbon monoxide, or "CO" is an odorless, colorless, and tasteless gas; it is hazardous because it can go undetected until those exposed to it experience ill symptoms. This is a serious situation that should be given every consideration to prevent. Early symptoms include nausea, headache, fatigue, cramping, and confusion. Help Ogden Fire Department continue meeting the goal of no more deaths by CO poisoning by following these simple steps:

- **Perform regular maintenance on all fuel-burning appliances.**
- **When operating generators, place them where exhaust cannot enter the home.**
- **Don't run vehicles inside garages.**
- **Place a carbon monoxide detector near bedrooms to monitor for CO.**

Please obtain a CO detector in your home if you do not have one. The City offers discounted CO detectors to residents for \$10—about half the regular cost—at Ogden City's Cashier's office, 2549 Washington Blvd, Ste 240.
