Ogden Electric Vehicle Charging Stations "Plug-In Celebration"

May 20th, Ogden City held a "Plug-In Celebration" to celebrate its first four public electric vehicle charging stations.

The event, held at the Ogden Municipal Building parking lot where the new charging stations are installed, was attended by city staff, elected officials, residents, members of Ogden City's Sustainability Committee, community partners such as Rocky Mountain Power and Weber State University, and more.

These charging stations are open to anyone with an electric vehicle. Charging sessions are limited to two hours, and the vehicle must be plugged in and charging to be parked in the spot. The ADA-accessible charging stall may only be used by a non-ADA user if all other stations are occupied. There is currently no fee or app required to use the stations. There are four 10 kW, Level 2, J1772 ports. The stations can be used by EVs with other ports if the driver of the vehicle has the correct adapter.

Ogden City Mayor Ben Nadolski spoke at the celebration, thanking both the Ogden City Council and Rocky Mountain Power, along with the many city staff who helped on the project. He noted that while these are the first city-owned charging stations, they will not be the last. Already, the city has plans to put in charging stations at the Marshall White Center and the Wonderblock parking structure, both of which are currently under construction. The charging stations, depending on the vehicle being charged, should provide up to 35 miles of range per hour of charging. The average U.S. driver travels about 37 miles per day, so a 2-hour charge at a 10 kW charger should provide the necessary range for the daily travels of most people.

Emergency Preparedness: Water Storage

Even though we had a wet spring, we are still in a drought. Now that summer has come, water conservation is on everyone's mind. But what about water consumption after an emergency? Having clean water for drinking, cooking, and hygiene should be a top priority. Will you be prepared if Ogden had a water emergency? Take steps now to store emergency water supplies for you and your family.

- Store at least 1 gallon of water per person per day for a minimum 3-day supply—for example, a family of 4 needs 12 gallons.**
- Be sure to account for pets; dogs and cats typically need 1 gallon daily.**
- Store water in a cool, dark place in your home, office, or car.**
- Replace water every six months, and be sure to check expiration dates on store-bought water.**

If you use your own containers to store water, sanitize them first. To sanitize:

Wash containers with dishwashing soap and rinse with water.

Sanitize by swishing a solution of 1 teaspoon of liquid household chlorine bleach to a quart of water on all interior surfaces of the container.

Rinse thoroughly with clean water before use.

Avoid re-using containers that have ever held a toxic substance or containers that can break. Use of food-grade water storage containers, such as those found at surplus or camping supply stores, is recommended if you prepare stored water yourself.

Making Water Safe

Boiling: Boiling is the surest method to make drinking water safer by killing disease-causing organisms, including viruses, bacteria, and parasites. Boil for 10-12 minutes, allow to cool before drinking.

Filtration: Choose a filter small enough to remove both bacteria and parasites. Most filters will not remove viruses. Use per manufacturer's recommendation.

When rotating out your old water storage, please don't waste it! Use that water for your grass and plants.
