

Ogden Pride is a dynamic community organization dedicated to fostering a safe and inclusive environment, through diverse and cultural experiences that foster a sense of acceptance for LGBTQ+ individuals and their allies in Ogden, Utah.

The organization hosts an annual festival, now celebrating its 10th year. This event is only one of many, as they host year-round programs: Youth OUTreach, for youth ages 20 and under, and Queer Connections, a social support group for anyone 18/21+, as well as partner with S.O.A.P. Ogden for folks 50+. The annual Ogden Pride festival is happening at the Ogden Amphitheater on Saturday, August 3, 2024.

On July, 8, 1968, the first arrow was found in the tummy of Hoi Toi, the China Nite Buddha that watched over Washington Boulevard. The restaurant was owned by Glen Hong in 1963. The Buddha statue would see many more arrows over the years until the restaurant was closed in 2016.
