Ogden City Adopted Budget For Fiscal Year 2025

On August 6, the Ogden City Council adopted the annual budget for Fiscal Year 2025. This year's budget process included public input and collaboration among Council members, administration, department directors, and city staff.

A key focus of this budget is providing city employees with competitive wages. It incorporates a compensation study by an outside consultant, introducing new salary ranges and titles to attract and retain quality employees.

"One of the underlying themes that we heard from department directors was that we have a heavy workload and face the challenge of burnout," Council Chair Ken Richey said. "We expect the changes made to salaries and title changes along with the additional 16 positions will alleviate that."

Employees below the market range will be brought to the minimum of their new salary range and may receive a merit increase of up to 4%. Those within the new range are eligible for a 4% increase. The study's recommendations were partially funded by a \$900,000 salary carryforward from the previous fiscal year.

The proposed budget included a 1% tax increase for mental health resources for public safety employees and a transfer of \$1.8 million from BDO Lease Revenue to the General Fund to offset operational costs due to inflation.

Council members expressed concerns about using BDO funds for ongoing expenses rather than one-time expenses. The Council and administration collaborated to address these concerns, resulting in a decision to maintain last year's Certified Property Tax Rate. This will generate about \$1 million in additional property tax revenue, resulting in a 5.36% property tax increase, or approximately \$26 on the average residential property tax bill.

The fee structure for utilities was also updated to adjust for inflation and help fund the \$100 million Canyon Waterline Project.

Emergency Preparedness: National Preparedness Month

September is National Preparedness Month, an initiative by FEMA aimed at preparing

Americans for a range of emergencies, from natural disasters to potential terrorism threats. The goal is to encourage individuals to be ready for both widespread and local emergencies, emphasizing that while emergency services are crucial, personal preparedness can significantly enhance survival and aid community recovery. Key steps include staying informed about local risks, utilizing apps and resources (like Code Red, FEMA, NOAA, RED Cross) for emergency preparation, assembling a three-day disaster supply kit, and creating a Family Emergency Plan. Additionally, sharing your preparedness journey on social media with #Natlprep or joining a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) can motivate others and amplify community readiness. The essence of this initiative is simple yet powerful: understand your risks, prepare actively, and lead by example to foster resilience against unforeseen disasters during National Preparedness Month and beyond.
