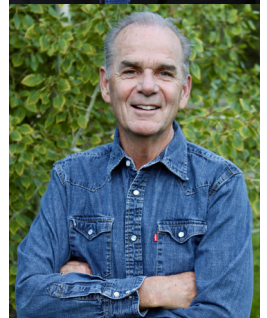
What goals do you have for yourself as a Council member entering your second year?

Emergency Preparedness: Winter Storms

Winter storms increase the risk of car accidents, hypothermia, frostbite, carbon monoxide poisoning, and heart attacks from overexertion. They can also cut off heat, power, and potential communication services, putting older adults, children, sick individuals, and pets at greater risk. If a winter storm warning is issued, it's important to find shelter immediately.

Know Your Winter Weather Terms:

Stay informed by monitoring weather reports and alerts

Winter Storm Warning: This is issued when hazardous winter weather, such as heavy snow, freezing rain, or sleet, is imminent or occurring. These warnings are issued 12 to 24 hours before the storm is expected to begin.

Winter Storm Watch: Notifies the public about the possibility of a blizzard, heavy snow, freezing rain, or sleet. Winter Storm Watches are generally issued 12 to 48 hours before a storm is expected to start.

Winter Weather Advisory: Issued when accumulations of snow, freezing rain, freezing drizzle, or sleet create significant inconveniences. If caution is not exercised, these conditions could lead to life-threatening situations.

Preparing for Winter Weather:

Get your home ready for cold weather by improving insulation, sealing gaps with caulking, and using weather stripping. Prevent pipes from freezing and regularly test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors with backup batteries. Prepare a supply kit for potential power outages, including medications and pet supplies. Store extra batteries for radios and flashlights. In case of an emergency, have an emergency kit in your vehicle with common emergency kit items including warm clothing and blankets. Make sure to always keep your gas tank full.
