- 2828 Harrison Blvd (Ogden High South parking lot)
- 1845 Monroe Blvd (Green waste facility)
- 502 Wall Ave (4th Street ballpark West parking lot)

Be Idle Free Month

The Ogden City Council is promoting cleaner air and healthier living through Idle-Free Month. Every February, Ogden City collaborates with the Ogden School District, Weber State University, and the Weber-Morgan Health Department to raise awareness about the impact of vehicle idling on air quality. With our city prone to inversion, car exhaust significantly contributes to air pollution—a concern affecting all residents. Throughout the month, Council members will visit local schools during pick-up and drop-off hours to encourage parents and guardians to turn off their engines while waiting. These visits aim to educate the community about the benefits of reducing idling and inspire positive change for a healthier Ogden.

Did you know?

- Idling for just 10 seconds wastes more fuel than restarting your car.
- Turning off your car reduces harmful emissions, including carbon monoxide and nitrogen oxides, which contribute to smog and respiratory issues.
- Children are particularly vulnerable to poor air quality, with pollution affecting their lung development and increasing the risk of asthma.
- Ogden's air quality is significantly impacted by inversion, where pollutants become trapped close to the ground during colder months, exacerbating the problem.

Residents are encouraged to join the effort by adopting idle-free habits, such as turning off vehicles when waiting for extended periods. Small changes can lead to a significant impact, improving air quality and reducing fuel waste.

Get A Free Tree For Your Parking Strip

Ogden's tree-lined streets establish the character of our neighborhoods, and the trees we plant today will be enjoyed by generations to come.

Each year, the City provides a tree nursery so Ogden City residents can get a free tree to plant in their parking strip that matches the yard's needs and the street's plan.

Beginning April 1st, trees will be given away every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Please call the Parks & Cemetery Office beginning March 17th at 801-629-8284 to schedule an appointment to pick up a tree at Ogden's Green Waste Facility located at 1845 Monroe Blvd. Free tree's are limited to one per household and will be available until the inventory is exhausted.

Residents must provide information about overhead power lines, the length and width of their parking strip, and the lot location, as well as a current Ogden Water bill and picture ID. Please limit the number of people who come to the tree nursery to two individuals. If you have questions, please call 801-629-8284.

Zone Ogden – Development Code Update

Recently, Logan Simpson, the consultant team, met with the Planning Commission and the project advisory committee to review standards for Nonresidential Zones (Commercial,

Industrial, and Civic) and General Provisions and Procedures for administering the development code. Ogden City would like to share this information with the public at the next Zone Ogden Open House, scheduled for February 26, 2025, at 5:30 p.m. at the Union Station. This will be an opportunity for the community to review proposed standards and to provide valuable input.

Ogden City Cemetery Spring Clean-Up

Ogden City Cemetery crews will begin spring clean-up of the cemetery on Monday, March

17, 2025. It takes approximately one week for this process to be complete. Before that date, patrons are encouraged to pick up all grave decorations, including flowers, statues, shepherds' hooks, solar lights, vases, fences, rocks, etc. Remembrances can be placed back after Monday, March 27, 2025.

As a reminder, fences, solar lights, statues, rocks, and other such grave decorations are not allowed in the cemetery during the maintenance season: March 15, 2025, through October 15, 2025.

Emergency Preparedness: Power Outages

A power outage can always be a possibility throughout the year, but it is especially likely during the winter and the consistent storms the season may bring. Some power outages may last just a few hours to even a few days. It's important to be prepared for when one could be without power for several days.

Things for you to do:

- Have a 72-hour kit, which includes a flashlight, radio, batteries, food, blankets, and water.
- Call Rocky Mountain at 1-877-508-5088 and report power outages.
- Keep your laptop fully charged to plug your phone into it.
- Never use kerosene or propane heaters for your home without proper ventilation.
- Know how to override your electric garage door opener.
- If you see a downed power line, call 911 and keep a safe distance away.
- Never plug a generator into your house unless you have an approved transfer switch installed.
- Never operate a generator inside your house or garage; keep it at least 10' away with the exhaust facing away from the house.
- Ensure the total electric load on your generator won't exceed the generator's rating.
