## Ogden Wellbeing Survey Results Now Available

The Ogden City Council recently received the results from the 2024 Utah Wellbeing Survey, which are now available for anyone to review. This project is a statewide research initiative led by Utah State University that gathers data on the wellbeing of residents across cities and towns in Utah to support local planning and decision-making.

Hundreds of Ogden residents completed the survey, offering valuable insight into how our community is experiencing life from health and safety to environmental quality and economic development. The findings offer a nuanced look at both personal and community wellbeing, highlighting areas of strength and opportunities for growth.

The survey results show:

72% of respondents rated their personal wellbeing as high, while community wellbeing scored lower overall, with safety and environmental quality emerging as priority concerns.

The most valued aspects of life in Ogden include family life, access to nature, recreation opportunities, and the city's cultural diversity.

Respondents emphasized concerns over air quality, water supply, affordable housing, and traffic, along with the pace of growth and development.

Community connection varied across districts, but many respondents shared a strong sense of place and appreciation for what makes Ogden unique.

## New Electric Vehicle Charging Stations at Union Station

Ogden City has partnered with Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) and Electrify America (EA) to install eight new DC fast charging stations at Union Station. Each of the four pairs of stations will share 360 kW of power, shared dynamically if both are being used simultaneously.

These chargers will be operated by EA and will cost \$0.27/kWh for RMP customers who register in the EA app for the discounted rate. Those who are not RMP customers or registered for the discount will pay \$0.45/kWh. You can also receive an additional \$0.05/kWh credit for charging during off-peak hours, which are all hours outside of on-peak, listed below.

On-Peak: October through May inclusive 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m., and 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays. June through September inclusive 3:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays.

Off-Peak: All other times.

## Water Quality Tip: Preventing Backflow Siphonage

**Spring is here! We all like to keep garden hoses attached to our homes for easy use.**

If a hose is used to fill a bucket, a dog bath, or a swimming pool, and the hose is left in that basin, you could be subjecting your drinking water to contaminants. While this is happening, a fire hydrant may be in use, or a water line could break. Either of these events uses a lot of water and may cause a siphon that could pull water back into your home's potable water system.

Please consider purchasing an affordable hose bibb vacuum breaker from your local supply store. These screw onto your hose outlet to prevent siphonage. For information, please call Ogden City's Backflow Prevention Department at 801-629-8317.

## Emergency Preparedness: Flood Safety

**Flooding is one of the most common hazards in the United States, especially during run-off season.** It is important to be aware of flood hazards no matter where you live,

especially if you reside in a low-lying area, near water, or downstream from a dam. Even small streams, gullies, creeks, culverts, dry streambeds, or areas of low-lying ground that seem harmless when dry can flood unexpectedly.

If flooding is likely, follow these safety tips:

- **Listen to the radio or television for updates**
- **Check Ogden City's social media pages for flood information and updates**
- **Do not walk through moving water; as little as six inches can make you fall. If you must walk in water, try to stay in areas where the water is not moving**
- **If you have to walk in water, walk where the water is not moving. Use a stick to check the firmness of the ground in front of you**
- **Avoid driving into flooded areas. If floodwaters rise around your vehicle, abandon it and move to higher ground if it is safe to do so. You and your vehicle can be quickly swept away**

Everyone should understand the flood risk to their home and property. Keep in mind that homeowners insurance typically does not cover flooding unless you have specific flood insurance. For more information, visit:
