**Ogden Invites Community to Help Shape the Future of Wall Avenue**

**Ogden, UT** – Ogden City is inviting the community to participate in a public workshop to help reimagine Wall Avenue, a major corridor running through the heart of downtown Ogden, connecting community with business. The Wall Avenue Corridor Plan is a key piece to the MAKE Ogden Downtown Master Plan passed unanimously by Ogden City Council in 2020.

The Wall Avenue Workshop is set for **Wednesday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 5:30pm inside historic Union Station**. Ogden City Planning Division will present design concepts aimed at transforming this vital roadway into a safer, more welcoming space for all modes of transportation. Consultants Kimley-Horn and Design Workshop will be on hand to discuss how the concepts were developed, what data is being used to guide the planning process and explain the constraints and opportunities for future demand. Residents can meet with city staff to ask questions and advise on which concepts align with their vision of downtown Ogden.

“The goal is to develop a long-term vision that balances traffic efficiency with the comfort and safety of pedestrians, cyclists, transit riders and drivers alike as they travel this gateway into the city,” said Brandon Rypien, Senior Planner with Ogden City. “We’re looking forward to hearing from our community and working together to shape a more connected downtown.”

MAKE Ogden is the city’s long-range downtown master plan, designed to guide redevelopment and public investment over the next 25 years. Rooted in community values, the plan outlines strategies to enhance mobility, grow economic opportunities, preserve historic assets and create vibrant public spaces. By reimagining key corridors like Wall Avenue, MAKE Ogden seeks to support a thriving downtown that connects people and places.
