How To Stay Informed – A Quick Guide

Transparency and accessibility continue to be priorities for the Ogden City Council. Each item brought before the Council is carefully reviewed, with public input playing an important role in the decision-making process. To ensure Ogden residents can stay informed and provide feedback, below are several ways to stay up to date with Council issues.

Notify Me®

Agendas and meeting materials for work sessions, City Council meetings, Redevelopment Agency, and Municipal Building Authority meetings are usually posted the Thursday before Tuesday meetings. With Notify Me® on our website, you can subscribe to receive email or text alerts for these materials as soon as they're available. Scan the QR to get signed up for customized updates from the City Council and other departments.

Social Media

Before each meeting, agendas and detailed packet information are shared on the Ogden City Council's Facebook, Instagram, and X (formerly Twitter) accounts. Follow the City Council on these platforms to get updates directly in your feed and stay on top of the latest Council business at your convenience. Just search for "Ogden City Council" on your platform of choice to find us.

Watch Live Meetings

Unable to attend a meeting in person? Anyone can watch Ogden City Council and RDA work sessions and meetings live on Facebook and YouTube. To participate in a public hearing or make comments remotely, participants can join via the application Zoom using the same meeting ID for all meetings: 885-1140-9420.

Post-Meeting Recaps

After each meeting, the Council releases a "Quick Meeting Recap" video on Facebook and Instagram that highlights what was discussed and what decisions were made. Full meeting recordings are available on-demand through Facebook, YouTube, and our podcast, with timestamps to easily find topics of interest and listen to the full conversation. Snow Removal Reminder

As the winter season approaches Ogden City Code Services would like to remind residents to help keep our sidewalks safe and accessible this winter. **City Code 7-2-8**

Property owners, occupants, or their agents must clear snow from sidewalks within 12 hours after snowfall ends (or within 12 hours after the next sunrise if it snowed overnight). If snow turns to ice and can't be removed, it must be covered with sand or a similar material within 24 hours.

If not cleared, the City may remove it and charge the cost to the property owner.

Snow from private property may not be placed in the public right-of-way, and snow cleared from sidewalks or driveways cannot be piled in a way that creates hazards for drivers or pedestrians.

Union Station Neighborhood Open House

Planning and design around the Union Station Neighborhood will continue next year with an open house planned for Wednesday, January 28, inside Union Station's Browning Theater at 5:30pm.

Ogden City's partners and the community will gather to discuss the next steps in the design process for the land surrounding the historic centerpiece of Ogden City. A concept plan was selected by city officials that keeps Union Station as a cultural hub, including museums, an expanded train hall, outdoor plaza with commercial and housing options to the north.

Emergency Preparedness: Stay Warm and Safe This Winter

Inspect Chimneys and Vents

Have your chimney checked yearly, especially if you use your fireplace often. Burn only dry, seasoned wood to reduce smoke and creosote buildup.

Test Smoke Alarms

Change smoke alarm batteries twice a year—daylight saving time is a good reminder.

Need a smoke or carbon monoxide detector? Residents can buy one for \$10 at the Ogden Municipal Building (2549 Washington Blvd, 2nd Floor Cashier). Install smoke detectors:

1. **In the hallway outside bedrooms**
2. **Inside each bedroom**
3. **On every floor**

Additional steps you can take to stay warm, but safely to prevent house fires this season are the following:

- **Use Fireplace Screens:** Use a metal screen or tempered glass and keep kids and pets at least three feet away.
- **Use Candles Carefully:** Place candles on stable surfaces, away from anything flammable, and never leave them unattended.
- **Space Heater Safety:** Keep heaters three feet from anything that can burn. Use models with automatic shut-off, plug directly into the wall, and keep children and pets clear.
