Three Facts to Help You Recycle this Spring

Blue recycle carts can be requested from Ogden City and collected with regular garbage services at no extra charge in order to promote Ogden City's environmental initiatives.

Here are three facts to help keep you informed while using your recycle carts:

1. **Styrofoam** is not recyclable and should be put in the green trash carts.
2. **Large boxes** that are too big need to be broken down in order to fit in the blue recycle carts.
3. **Green Waste** is not allowed in recycle carts, but it is accepted at the green waste facility on Monroe Blvd.

When placing your carts out by 6:00 a.m. on the street for collection, make sure they are at least five feet away from each other and any hanging tree branches, mailboxes, or parked vehicles.

Weber State University's sustainability offices and the Weber-Morgan and Davis County Health Departments are hosting the Cut Pollution – Mow Electric program. Emergency Preparedness Message: Shelter and Temperature Control

Evacuating or Sheltering in place during an emergency depends on the situation and the instructions of the local authorities. Make sure you are prepared for either situation by following these tips:

1. **Make sure you have heat and shelter necessities prepared in a 72-hour kit before evacuating.** Tube tents, emergency sleeping bags, and solar blankets are lightweight options for shelter. Hand warmers, waterproof matches, and emergency candles provide the heat necessary to survive.
2. **If shelter in place (SIP) is issued by local authorities, remain inside your home or business.** This may be due to an accidental release of toxic chemicals or emergencies involving hazardous materials where air quality may be threatened. Take children and pets inside immediately, while covering your mouth and nose with a damp cloth to provide a minimal amount of protection.
3. **During SIP, block and avoid all forms of entrance or ventilation while taking shelter in an above-ground room.** Stay away from windows, doors, and fireplace dampers while turning off all fans, heating or air conditioning systems. Place wet towels under door cracks and tape plastic sheeting or garbage bags over doors, windows, exhaust fans, vents, and outlets.
4. **Make sure you have a radio and are listening for updates and instructions on the situation.** During SIP, make sure to stay in place until it is communicated that the area is safe or evacuation is needed.
