Fair Housing is NOT an Option! It's the Law!

April is nationally recognized as Fair Housing month, and Ogden City honors this by encouraging education about Fair Housing rights. Each citizen is entitled to equal access to housing opportunities regardless of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, familial status or source of income. Signs of housing related discrimination could include the following.

- **Rent or deposit** quoted is higher than advertised.
- **The manager comments** about the facility to discourage your interest or says the unit is rented, but the ad or sign is still posted.
- **A real estate agent "steers"** you to look for houses in neighborhoods different than ones you desire and think you can afford.
- **The manager denies** your request to make minor modifications to your unit to accommodate your disability.

Fair Housing rights are protected by Federal and State Law, and the Utah Anti-Discrimination and Labor Division (UALD) can be contacted for information, questions or concerns on this issue.

Not All Plastics are Recyclable

Ogden City recycling plants only accept plastics that contain a #1 or #2 located inside the chasing arrow symbol. If recycled incorrectly, these plastics will lose their recyclability and will be rejected by the facility. Mixing with food debris or placing #1 and #2 plastics inside non-recyclable plastic shopping bags causes this to occur.

The following items **cannot** be placed inside blue recycling carts:

- **Grocery Bags/ Produce Bags** (Take these to store drop off sites)
- **Bubble Wrap/ Cellophane**
- **Garbage Bags**
- **Motor Oil Containers**
- **6-Pack Holders**
- **Wading Pools/ Any Bulk Plastics**
- **Coolers**
- **Egg Boxes**
- **Styrofoam Pellets**
- **Plastic Coated Drink Cartons**
- **Miscellaneous Plastic Chunks**

Emergency Preparedness Message: Transportation

You never know when you might become stranded in your vehicle. It could occur on a deserted highway, or even a busy freeway during rush hour traffic. Be ready to take care of yourself and your family during such an occasion by taking the following precautions when traveling.

1. **Maintain half a tank of gas**
2. **Keep vehicles serviced for seasonal changes**
3. **Keep an emergency kit in the car** (Include: food, water, blankets, matches, flashlights, flares, jumper cables, tow strap, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, personal sanitation items, seasonal shoes)
