Nine Rails Creative District and The Monarch will be Future Home to Ogden Artists and Creative Industries



Ogden City, along with many community partners, is developing a plan for the new Nine Rails Creative District. As the plan nears completion, work on a major project in the district has begun. The Monarch, a previously abandoned, historic building on the corner of 25th and Ogden Avenue, will be renovated into a hub for creative activity. The Nine Rails Creative District will become an epicenter for art and culture, where the creative community lives and works. This community is broadly defined to include anyone making, inventing, or creating something – from amateur furniture builders, to performing artists, to video game designers. Nine Rails will also be a place where the community can engage with art in new ways, particularly in the public realm. Finally, the creative district will establish a more vibrant, active connection

between Downtown and East Central. More information about the plan and opportunities to provide input can be found on the Ogden City website and by following @ninerailsogden on Facebook. The Monarch, located in the Nine Rails Creative District, recently hosted a ground-breaking ceremony. The primary goal of this major renovation project is to preserve the building's architectural integrity, while greatly improving its safety, appearance, and usability. This venue will offer new restaurant space, retail and event space, exhibit and collaborative space, and creative studios. The Monarch is tentatively scheduled for completion by spring 2019. Protect Your Home Before a Wildfire Threatens Your Area

To Reduce External Fuel for Fires:

- **Clear** leaves, dead vegetation and other debris from gutters, porches and decks (*including underneath*), and from within 10 feet of the house.
- **Remove** flammable materials (*firewood stacks, propane tanks*) within 30 feet of your home's foundation and outbuildings, including garages and sheds.
- **Prune** trees so the lowest branches are 6 to 10 feet from the ground.
- **Hydrate** and maintain your lawn. Cut down brown, dry grass and shrubs to reduce fire intensity.



To Prevent Embers from Entering Your Home:

- **Inspect** shingles or roof tiles. Replace or repair those that are loose or missing to prevent ember penetration.
- **Cover** exterior attic vents with metal wire mesh no larger than 1/8 inch to prevent sparks from entering the home.
- **Enclose** under-eave and soffit vents or screens with metal mesh to prevent ember entry.

Emergency Preparedness Message: Personal Items

Appropriate clothing and personal items for every member of your family are necessities in a grab-n-go kit. Make sure to consider these items while creating your own kit for emergency preparation.

1. **Include a seasonal change of clothes.** Beneficial items would be a long-sleeved shirt, long pants, sturdy shoes, rain gear, a hat, work gloves and thermal underwear.
2. **Don't forget personal comforts or necessities.** Items like toothbrushes, tooth paste, soap and moist towelettes will be appreciated to maintain basic hygiene in a disaster. Sunglasses, games, books, puzzles and activities for children will help to pass the time waiting for assistance during an emergency.
3. **Consider those with special needs.** Formula, diapers, medications, denture needs, extra eyeglasses, or batteries for hearing aids should be available for any members of the group with special needs such as infants, elderly, or those with disabilities.
4. **Carry alternative methods of currency.** Keeping traveler's checks or cash in smaller bills on hand will help if the power is out and credit cards are unusable.
