Stay Safe While Exploring the Ogden Trails this Summer

Practicing trail safety awareness and etiquette while hiking the Ogden trails allows all visitors to have an optimal experience among the outdoor summer ambience.

Here are some factors to be aware of before venturing outside.

- **Check weather and trail conditions.** Not only is it dangerous to go out during inclement weather, but trails that are wet or muddy in the aftermath of rain are a safety hazard. The Weber Pathways website includes a feature where you can check current trail conditions.
- **Know what to bring.** Dressing appropriately for nature, as well as bringing enough water and sun protection can help prevent illness or injury from temperature related conditions while outside.
- **Stay on the path and respect those traveling along it.** Venturing away from the trail can be dangerous, and is an easy way to disrupt native plant and animal life or wander into restricted private property. The best practice is to avoid leaving any trace of human presence outside of footsteps on the trail. All pets should be kept on leashes and picked up after so they don't affect the experience of other hikers.

Five Tips to Help Have a Great Ogden Twilight Experience

Ogden Twilight promises nine amazing concerts throughout the summer months. Here are five ways to help have the best experience possible while attending the shows.

1. **Buy tickets online in advance and show up to the event early.** Ticket prices increase from \$10 to \$15 on the day of the concert if they haven't already sold out. Buying tickets beforehand online will ensure entry at the best price possible. Sold out shows will likely have a line to get into the amphitheater, so arriving early can decrease your wait time to enter the venue.
2. **Wear sunscreen and stay hydrated.** The sun won't go down until closer to 10:00 p.m., so dressing light and preparing for hot weather the majority of the night is beneficial.
3. **Bring cash.** Dinner and drinks, as well as merchandise, are available inside. Most vendors are cash only, and an ATM will be available with a service charge.
4. **Travel light.** Leave chairs, coolers, blankets and outside food/drink items at home, since they aren't allowed inside the Amphitheater. Pets are best left at home, as they won't be allowed to enter the venue unless they are service animals.
5. **Carpool with friends.** Parking will be limited downtown. Carpooling, riding the train or taking any available UTA public transit will lessen the stress of finding somewhere to leave your vehicle. Bike valet will be available. The Front Runner is free with your ticket. Tickets for the concerts are still available through vendor, 24tix. More information on attending events at the Ogden Amphitheater can be found on their city webpage. Summer Air Conditioning Installation Requires a Permit

As summer approaches, everyone hopes their air conditioning system will make it through the season without any major problems. A building permit is required when installing a new air conditioner or replacing an old unit. Obtaining a permit will ensure that the installation is compliant and meets the respective building codes to ensure the homeowner's safety. The contractor or the owner may obtain a permit at the Ogden City Building Services Offices (2549 Washington Blvd, Suite 240). After the installation is complete, the permit holder must call Building Services to schedule an inspection.

How to Respond to Sewer Back Ups

Here are a few things to think about to help maintain your sewer line before an expensive back up occurs:

- **Know how to react.** Stop all running water and check immediately during a potential back up. If water is still coming up in a floor drain, toilet or the lowest drain in your house, call the local sewer utility company (801-629-8331/801-629-8351) or after hours (801-629-8221). If the water stops backing up in your drain and it is your own line, you have to contact a rooter service or a local plumber.
- **Know your responsibilities.** Homeowners are responsible for cleaning, repairing and maintaining the sewer lateral that goes from the house out to the main line in the street. The city is responsible for the main line in the road and the connection to the main.
- **Know how to prevent the problem.** Never pour grease down the drain or toilet, let it cool down and dispose of it in the trash. Avoid planting deep-rooted trees over the sewer line. Do not flush feminine products, paper towels, diapers, baby wipes, or any cloth material down the sink or toilet. Schedule someone to come cut the roots in your lateral at least once a year if you know you have a root problem. Keep a lid on clean-out to prevent debris from falling into it and blocking the sewer.

Emergency Preparedness Message: Power and Light

1. **Keep sources of light and power in your 72-hour emergency kit.** Store candles, flashlights, and extra batteries in accessible places for emergency lighting. Use caution when using candles to avoid a fire. Hand-crank style flashlights are an alternative to battery operated flashlights, and always keep a battery operated, solar, or hand-crank NOAA weather radio to stay informed on things to come. Make sure to use generators appropriately and safely to avoid causing greater harm.
2. **Plan for communication during a power outage.** Since cordless and Internet phones don't work without electricity it's beneficial to have at least one traditional phone line that is hard wired to the wall and not cordless. For those with cell phones only, keep a portable power supply on hand to charge it, and use power saving modes during emergencies.
3. **Have a back up plan for medical devices and home entry.** Anyone that is electrically dependent on a medical device should have a generator, battery backup, or manual devices that can be used until power is restored. An extra key to the home should be available if the garage is the primary means of entering. Know how to operate the manual release lever of the electric garage door opener to avoid becoming locked in the home.
