

Emergency Preparedness Message: Communication

Creating a Family Emergency Communication Plan is essential during a disaster in order to send and receive information from your family. Communication networks, such as mobile phones and computers, could be unreliable during disasters, and electricity could be disrupted. Planning in advance will help ensure that all the members of your household—including children and people with disabilities and others with access and functional needs, as well as outside caregivers—know how to reach each other and where to meet up in an emergency:

1. **Collect and share information.** Create a paper copy of the contact information for your family and other important people. Ensure you have an out-of-town contact for everyone in your household to call. When local phone lines are overcrowded, long distance lines might be easier to get through.
2. **Practice your plan.** Have regular household meetings to review and practice your plan. Make sure your out-of-town contact agrees and knows what to expect in the event of an emergency.
3. **Texting is best.** When communicating with a mobile phone, a text message may get through when a phone call will not.
