Christmas Village Opening Gala, November 24

Christmas Village will light up downtown Ogden beginning November 24 after the Holiday Electric Light Parade. The festivities begin that day with the Santa Run 5k at 4:30 p.m., the Holiday Electric Light Parade at 5:30 p.m. and end with a firework show in the Ogden Amphitheater at the Christmas Village Opening Gala that begins at 6:30 p.m.

• **The Village:** This annual holiday display in Ogden will feature activities and entertainment until December 22, and the cottage lights will be available to view until January 1, 2019. Lights turn on from 5:00 p.m. to midnight every night and will transform Ogden's downtown Municipal Gardens (353 E 25th Street) into a winter wonderland themed after Santa's village at the North Pole. The theme this year is "All Aboard" and a train is hidden in each of the cottages for visitors to find as they explore the displays and vote for their favorite on the City website.

• **The Activities:** A Breakfast with Santa event will be hosted at the Ogden Union Station on December 1. Santa and Mrs. Claus will greet children in attendance and give each a small gift. Reservations are required to attend the event and can be made online. Children can visit Santa Claus in his castle for free (Hours: Monday – Friday | 6 – 9 p.m. & Saturdays | 5–9 p.m.), from November 24 through December 22. Mrs. Claus is also available for scheduled daytime Christmas Village tours with children. Visitors can take a holiday ride on the Mini Polar Express Train on the west end of the Municipal Gardens (Hours: Monday – Friday | 6–9 p.m. & Saturdays | 5–9 p.m.) or the Jupiter Train that boards at 25th Street and Grant (Hours: Monday and Friday | 6–9 p.m. & Saturdays | 5–9 p.m.). Live entertainment will show in the amphitheater, Monday through Saturday, from 6:30 – 8 p.m. until December 22.

City Snow and Ice Regulations Prevent Accidents

For public health and safety reasons, Ogden City Code prohibits blocking roads with vehicles and placing snow on the street. Comply with regulations for removing the snow near your home to keep everyone safer this winter.

• Park all vehicles and trailers off streets until the snow has been pushed to the curb.

Ridges of snow plowed around vehicles parked on streets will freeze and prevent or slow down future snow removal and may also cause accidents when any vehicle hits them. (Section 10.5.21)

• Clear snow from sidewalks as soon as possible, but no later than 12 hours after snow has ceased falling.

This is to prevent the snow from turning into an icy hazard for pedestrians that forces them to walk into the street.

(Section 7.2.8A)

• Do not place snow removed from driveways or sidewalks onto the street.

Aim snow blowers away from sidewalks, the park strip and the street.

(Section 7.2.8B)

Prevent Home Heating Equipment Fires

Half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the upcoming months of December, January, and February. Simple steps can prevent most heating-related fires from happening.

• Mind the distance.

Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like a furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.

Have a sturdy fireplace screen to stop sparks from flying and keep a three-foot “kid-free zone” around open fires and space heaters.

• Keep maintenance professional.

A qualified professional should install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer’s instructions. Have heating equipment and chimneys also cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.

• Practice safe habits.

Never use your oven to heat your home. Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed, and test all smoke alarms in the home at least once a month.

Emergency Preparedness Message: Tools

Besides food, water, and shelter, proper tools are important to include in an emergency preparedness kit. The following list of tools will assist with survival inside and outside of the home during a disaster.

• Tools for safety:

Fire extinguisher, adjustable wrench or shut-off tool for gas and water, UPS or a backup generator for needed equipment, work gloves, safety glasses, and a safety mask.

• Tools for convenience:

Cookware and utensils, can-opener, compass, multi-purpose tool, whistle, flashlight with extra batteries, matches, sewing kit, paper and pencil, emergency preparedness manual, and an area map.

• Tools for comfort:

Plastic sheeting, scissors, duct tape, rope, ax, broom, shovel and a simple toolkit with screw-drivers, hammer, and pliers.

• Tools for communication:

Battery-operated weather radio to receive alerts and two-way radios to keep communication open with those around you.
