


## Mayor's Awards in the Arts Recognition

## Candle Safety During the Winter

More candle fires start in living rooms, dens, dining rooms, and kitchens during the winter months than any other time of year. Here are four guidelines for candle lovers to follow to help avoid death, injury and property damage due to misuse.



- **Watch who and what is around the candle.** Candle holders need to be sturdy and kept on an uncluttered surface away from the unsupervised reach of children and pets. Designated adults should be the only ones to use candles, and they should never be lit in rooms with medical oxygen or near windows with hanging curtains and blinds.

- **Be vigilant during the holidays.** Keep burning candles away from flammable centerpieces and all holiday and hanging decorations, including natural and artificial Christmas trees. Ensure candles cannot be accidentally moved by guests.

- **Prepare alternative emergency lighting.** Avoid using candles during a power failure, especially when adding kerosene or any flammable fuel to a heating device. The flame could ignite the fumes. Use flashlights and battery-powered lamps instead when possible.

- **Handle flames with common sense.** Never leave a candle unattended and always extinguish them completely before leaving a room or going to sleep. Use candle holders that are sturdy, not flammable and large enough to collect dripping wax.

Styrofoam, plastic wrap, plastic Christmas trees and plastic tree decorations CAN NOT be included in the blue Ogden City recycle bins. Gift wrapping paper is acceptable. ## Emergency Preparedness Message: Valuables

Printed copies of important documents and related contact information are necessary for identification and reference in post-emergency recovery. Waterproof/fireproof safes are highly recommended for secure storage of valuable document copies and personal items that could be lost during a disaster. Consider the following list of valuable items when preparing emergency kits and storage.

- **Monetary Assets:** Jewelry, coins, cash, investment papers, retirement plans, bank accounts, and legal documents (powers of attorney, wills, health care proxies, etc.).
- **Identity Documents:** Passports, original birth certificates, and original social security cards.
- **Important Information:** Property insurance policies and agent contact information. List of family doctors, prescription medications, and contact information for all pharmacies in use. Information on outstanding debts and due dates.
- **Tangible Items:** CDs or an external hard drive containing digital copies of all family photos. Safe deposit box keys. Spare keys and titles to all vehicles. Additional suggestions for emergency preparedness kits can be found on utah.gov's Be Ready Utah website.
