Heritage Festival 150th Anniversary

The Heritage Festival 150th Anniversary on May 9, 10 and 11 celebrates Ogden City's historic role in the completion of the Transcontinental Railroad.

Ogden's growth as the "Junction City" began with the driving of the Golden Spike in 1869 that connected the Union Pacific and Central Pacific railroads. This downtown celebration will feature activities immersed in Ogden's history and will align with the rare meeting of the historic steam engines "Big Boy" No. 4014 and "Living Legend" No. 844.

• Meeting of the Trains and Golden Spike Historical Reenactment.

"Big Boy" No. 4014 and "Living Legend" No. 844 will appear together for the first time May 9 at 10:30 a.m. at Ogden Union Station. A historical reenactment and photo recreation will take place of the iconic moment when the last spike was tapped into place at Promontory Summit, creating America's first transcontinental railroad. No. 844 will arrive in Ogden on April 28 and stay on display at Ogden Union Station through May 11. No. 4014 is the world's only operating Big Boy locomotive and arrives in Ogden May 9. Residents wishing to view the engines and the historical reenactment are encouraged to arrive early, as large crowds are expected. The official viewing schedule for the locomotives can be found on the Union Pacific website.

• **Heritage Festival Activities.** The Heritage Festival 150th Anniversary is an annual celebration, but this event will be a special edition for the Union Station. The "Big Boy" and "Living Legend" steam trains will be on full display at Ogden Union Station throughout the weekend, with additional exhibits celebrating the influence of trains and the rail industry. All museums inside of the Union Station will be open to visitors free of charge during the festival. This event will also extend up Historic 25th Street May 9, 10 and 11 from 9 a.m. - 9 p.m. featuring historic presentations, live music, performances, vendors and community activities. Emergency Preparedness: Flooding

Flooding is the most common natural disaster in Utah. Run-off occurs in Northern Utah in early spring, and as temperatures rise, the streams and rivers begin to swell and saturate the ground. If temperatures rise too quickly or a high amount of spring rain descends, excess water has nowhere to go and flooding potential increases. This can also lead to landslides and debris flows, so being alert of safe conditions and practices is important.

- **Avoid flooded rivers and streams.** Keep children and pets safe from these areas.
- **Listen to news and weather alerts.** Don't drive or travel through flooded streets.
- **Don't walk through moving water.** Six inches of moving water can knock a person off their feet.
- **Check insurance policies.** Flood insurance is not part of regular homeowner's insurance and requires a separate policy.
