85th Annual Ogden Pioneer Days

Ogden Pioneer Days will celebrate 85 years with its annual rodeo events. Information on purchasing tickets for the PRCA Rodeo can be found online. The Cowboy Christmas Music and Poetry Festival is a new addition to rodeo supported events and First Friday Art Stroll, Monday Night Movies and other community programs will feature Western-themed content throughout July. A complete calendar of event details can be found on the official Ogden Pioneer Days website, and the following community events will bring large crowds and may affect local traffic.

- **July 15 | Horse and Hitch Parade:** This parade will begin at 7 p.m. and can be viewed along Washington Blvd or from the Ogden City Municipal Gardens.
- **July 24 | Grand Parade:** This parade will begin at 9 a.m. on 31st St, continue northbound on Washington Blvd and end on 20th St. These streets will be blocked and detours will be made available.
- **July 24 | Pioneer Days Fireworks.** Fireworks will begin immediately after the rodeo at Pioneer Stadium. Parking in the lot just east of Pioneer Stadium will be restricted. Traffic along Canyon Rd between 16th St and River Dr will be affected during the show.

Grilling Safety Tips for Summer

Grilling season is here, and the Ogden City Fire Department would like to remind the community to be safe this summer. Here are three habits that can help prevent accidental fires during summer barbecues:

- **Only use a grill outside.** Have a "safe zone" of 3-feet around the grill at all times that keeps it away from house siding, deck rails, children and pets.
- **Make sure to open a gas grill before lighting it and watch the flames.** Never leave any grills, fire pits or patio torches unattended.
- **Clean grills after each use to remove grease.** Place all grill coals in a metal trash can with a lid after they've cooled down.

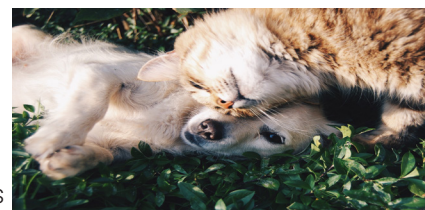

Emergency Preparedness: Pets

Don't forget about family pets when making emergency plans. Animals will require the same basics of survival, particularly food and water, that other household members require in emergency preparedness kits. Use the following tips to provide for them.

- **Keep pets properly identified.** Microchip identification, after collars and tags, is one of the best ways to ensure owners are reunited with pets. Keep the microchip registration up-to-date, and include at least one emergency number of someone who resides out of the immediate area. Have a copy of a photo with the pet to prove ownership or to make "lost pet" fliers.
- **Plan a pet-friendly place to stay.** Plan in advance for shelter alternatives that can host pets in an emergency, such as loved ones or friends outside of the immediate area. Never leave a pet behind during an evacuation.
- **Use the buddy system.** Exchange pet information, evacuation plans and house keys with a few trusted neighbors or nearby friends.
- **Prepare an emergency kit for each animal.** Stock up on pet items needed during a disaster including a one-week supply of food and water, medication and copies of vaccination records. Rotate supplies to keep them fresh.
- **Prepare safety and first aid supplies.** Have a carrier or leash for each animal to prevent them from escaping in a panic. Keep a pet first aid kit and identify emergency veterinary facilities outside the immediate area.
- **Plan for temporary confinement.** Physical structures, like walls, fences and barns may be destroyed during a disaster. Have a plan for keeping animals safely confined, including a tie-out, crate or kennel. Keep a list of locations and phone numbers for shelters or organizations that may find pets if they become lost during a disaster.
